INTRODUCTION

Overview

A) <u>Purpose</u>

This "Request for Proposal" is to solicit Contracts to upgrade the Information Infrastructure for the Full Employment Council.

B) <u>Who May Respond</u>

Only established IT Service providers may respond to this RFP. (Established is defined as having been in business for at least two consecutive years with verifiable accounts.)

D) <u>Right to Reject</u>

The Full Employment Council, Inc., **fiscal agent for the Kansas City and Vicinity and Eastern Jackson County Workforce Development Boards**, reserves the right to reject any and all proposals received in response to the RFP. A contract for the accepted proposal will be based upon the factors described in the RFP.

E) Small and/or Minority-Owned Businesses

Efforts will be made by the Full Employment Council, Inc. to contract with small and/or minorityowned businesses licensed to do business in the State of Missouri.

F) Compliance with Missouri Revised Statute § 285.530(1) Employee Eligibility Verification

- 1. The Proposer is required by sworn affidavit and provision of documentation, to affirm its enrollment and participation in a Federal work authorization program with respect to employees working in connection with the contracted services.
- 2. The Proposer shall also affirm that it does not knowingly employ any person in connection with the contracted services who does not have the legal right or authorization under Federal law to work in the United States as defined in 8 U.S.C. §1324a(h)(3).
- 3. The Proposer is required to obtain the same affirmation from all subcontractors at all tiers
- 4. Additionally, Contractor understands that if its Contract is selected, Contractor's contracted with FEC will affirmatively state that Contractor is not knowingly in violation of Missouri Revised Statute § 285.530(1) and shall not henceforth be in such violation, and Contractor will be required to sign a sworn affidavit under the penalty of perjury attesting to the fact that its employees are lawfully present in the United States.
- 5. Contractor further understands that FEC shall not be liable for any loss, liability, or claim arising out of Contractor's employment of an unauthorized alien.

G) <u>E-Verify Eligibility Verification System</u>

On June 6, 2008, President Bush issued Executive Order 13465, "Economy and Efficiency in Government Procurement through Compliance with Certain Immigration and Nationality Act provisions and the Use of an Electronic Employment Eligibility Verification System." The order mandates that all federal agencies that enter into contracts shall require, as a condition of each contract, that the contractor agrees to use an electronic employment eligibility verification system designated by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) to verify all new employees and all persons assigned by the contractor to perform work within the United States on the federal contract. J) Assignment

The Contractor agrees not to subcontract, assign, transfer, convey, sublet or otherwise dispose of the contract of any right, title, obligation or interest it may have therein.

K) Non-responsive Pproposals

Proposals will be judged non-responsive and removed from further consideration if any of the following occur:

L) Notification of Award

It is expected that a decision selecting the successful proposal will be made within two weeks (14) days of the closing date for the receipt of proposals. Proposals will be evaluated by the Selection Committee and will be recommended to the appropriate authority for approval. Upon conclusion of final negotiations with the successful firm, all Contractors submitting proposals in response to this Request for Proposals will be informed, in writing, of the decision.

FEC reserves the right to vary the provisions set forth herein at any time prior to the execution of the contract. FEC is under no legal requirement to award a contract based on making this Request for Proposal.

However, the Full Employment Council, Inc., reserves the right to make an award without further discussion of the proposals submitted. Therefore, proposals should be submitted initially on the most favorable terms, from both technical and price standpoints, that the Contractor can propose.

M) Relationship of the Parties

It is understood and agreed that Provider is a separate legal entity from FEC and neither it nor any of its employees, volunteers, or agents contracted by it shall be deemed for any purposes to be employees or agents of FEC. Provider assumes full responsibility for the actions of its personnel and volunteers while performing any services incident to the Contract, and shall remain solely responsible for their supervision, daily direction and control, payment of salary (including withholding of income taxes and social security), workers' compensation, disability benefits and like requirements and obligations. Nothing in the Agreement shall be deemed or construed to create any third party beneficiaries or otherwise give any third party any claim or right of action against any party to this Agreement.

N) Nondiscrimination and Labor Standards

As a condition to the award of financial assistance under WIOA from the Department of Labor, the Contractor assures, with respect to operation of the WIOA-funded program or activity and all agreements or arrangements to carry out the WIOA-funded program or activity, that it will comply fully with the nondiscrimination and equal opportunity provisions of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act, the Nontraditional Employment for Women Act of 1991; title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended; section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended; the Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended, title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, as amended; and with all applicable requirements imposed by or pursuant to regulations implementing those laws, including but not limited to 29 CFR part 34. The Contractor shall immediately take any measures necessary to effectuate this requirement.

Q) Methods and Procedures of Payment

The FEC will make payments based on a negotiated payment schedule. Each billing Must consist of an invoice and progress report. Payment will only be made after FEC's Project Manager approves the progress report and invoice. FEC will not pay in full for hardware, software or service until received by FEC.

R) Bonding & Insurance Requirements

1. A surety document in the form of a cashier's check or bid bond, payable to the FEC in the amount of **One Thousand and 100 Dollars (\$1,100.00)**, must accompany the submitted

proposal and be fully and immediately negotiable for 90 calendar days following the date of bid opening. No negotiable instrument other than a cashier's check or bid bond will be accepted. This surety document may be forfeited in the event the Offeror fails to comply with the terms and conditions of the RFP and his proposal.

- 2. The surety document submitted by unsuccessful Offerors will be returned at the time the Notice of Award is issued to the successful Offeror or at the end of the 90 day period upon written request by the Offeror.
- 3. The surety document may, at the sole discretion of the FEC, be returned prior to the 90 day period upon written request by Offeror.

SECTION 2 - SCOPE OF WORK

A) PURPOSE

This document constitutes a request for competitive, sealed proposals from prospective proposers for IT infrastructure upgrade for the Full Employment Council (FEC), in accordance with the requirements and provisions stated herein. The goal of this project is to create a solid IT foundation that is built on virtualizing providing efficiencies and provide an appropriate redundancy and storage capacity. The objectives of this upgrade are:

- Replace existing server and computing infrastructure at/beyond end of life
- Improve and consolidate network performance
- Provide increased network capacity and provide future expansion capability
- Improve the network's fault tolerance, security
- Ability for remote monitoring and management of server infrastructure.
- Improve application performance.
- Provide Active Directory functionality for improved access and security controls.
- Provide high availability for business resiliency.

Proposers shall include all labor, material, tools, equipment, incidentals, licensing, maintenance and support in accordance with the Scope of Work.

B) Current Environment Overview

- 1. FEC has its main corporate office located at 1740 Paseo Blvd, Kansas City, Mo. 64108, and has six satellite offices. Total number of staff 100-125
- 2. FEC has outsourced its IT Management Services to Technology Group Solution. They provide support from the lower-level Desktop to High-End Network system Management;
- 3. FEC maintains a wide area network with a fiber backbone connecting the <u>six buildings</u> in the Kansas City area. Current MPLS and Internet Services Provider is <u>United Private Network</u>. *The main office has 500 mb and the satellite offices 100 mb each*.
- 4. Network Infrastructure has not been updated significantly since 2010 resulting in most network devices being end-of-life or outdated. FEC is in the process of upgrading its phone system and voicemail.
- 5. FEC's data Center, the main virtual Server (Scale), has 4 node Scale Cluster and has the following attributes with minimum utilization. All VMs and physical servers are running Windows Server Standard 2016.
 - 24 physical cores (6x4).
 - 256gb RAM (64x4).
 - 9.6 TB disk (2.4x4).
 - 16 network ports 4 copper 1000base-T ports per node.
- All the HP access switches have reached their recommended usage lifespan
- 6. FEC has maintained a centralized IT Management System where all locations come to the central office to access the Public web. FEC uses SOPHO Firewall that is just upgraded in November 2020. It uses Barracuda onsite and on the cloud backup system. Each satellite office has a small File/Print Server.

- 7. FEC's Firewall, Backup, and Voice mail system are located at the main office, at 1740 Paseo. Independence, Northland, South KC, and Richmond locations all have their own small physical server for domain connectivity and File/Print and FEC has Resource Rooms and Computer Lab (Classrooms) at each Center that the public can access for Job search and training. Staff computers are 100-125 and Resource/Class Room Computer 150-200.

Contractors also understands that it shall be a breach of ethical standards for any payment, gratuity or offer of employment to be made by or on behalf of a subcontractor under a contract to the prime contractor or higher tier subcontractor or any person associated therewith, as an inducement for the award or a subcontract or order.

Contractor also understands that it shall be a breach of ethical standards for a person to be retained, or to retain a person, to solicit or secure a metropolitan government contract upon the agreement or understanding for a contingent commission, percentage or brokerage fee, except for the retention of bona fide employees or bona fide established commercial selling agencies for the purpose of securing business.

Contractor represents that it has not retained anyone in violation of the foregoing.

Contractor also understands that a breach of ethical standards could result in civil or criminal sanctions and/or debarment or suspension from being a seller, contractor or subcontractor under metropolitan government contracts.
